On the 17th and 18th of July, 2021, the Debate Committee of SOL, NMIMS, Navi Mumbai organized an Online National level debate competition- ERISTICA 2.0. This was the second edition of ERISTICA which was marked to be a great success in the history of debate competitions at NMIMS, Navi Mumbai.

The event was memorable and remarkable in all parameters. There were more than 90 participants from all over India. The competition was conducted in 3 rounds. The first round, that is the preliminary round, was held on 17th July 2021 from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM. For the


orator in the future. After this round, 4 participants qualified for the final round.
