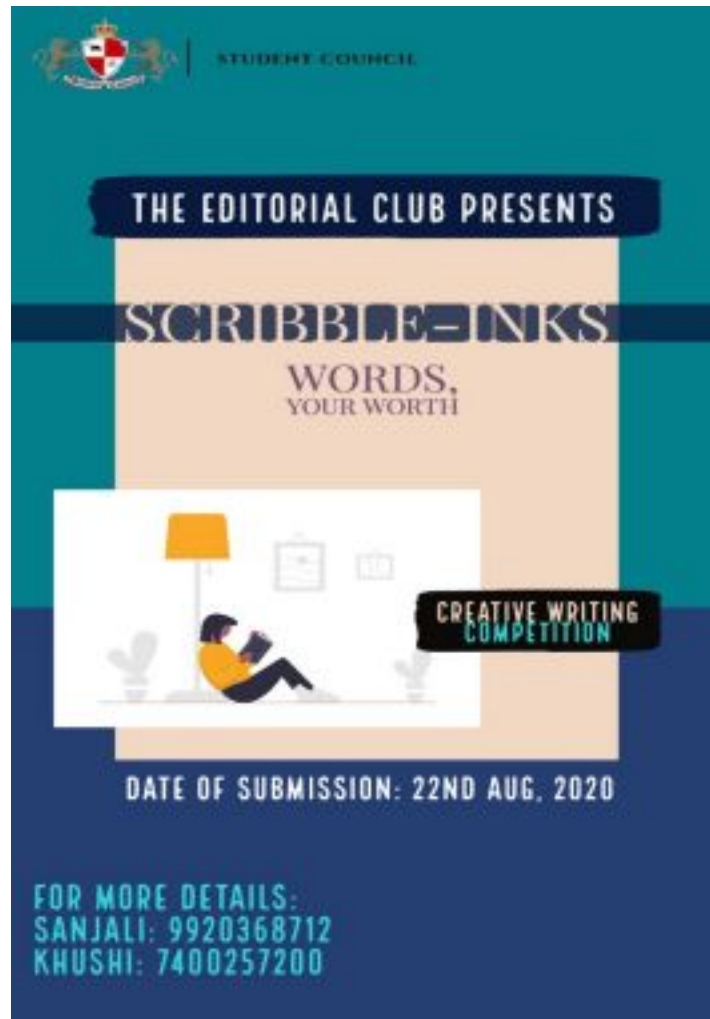


## SCRIBBLE INKS: WORDS, YOUR WORTH

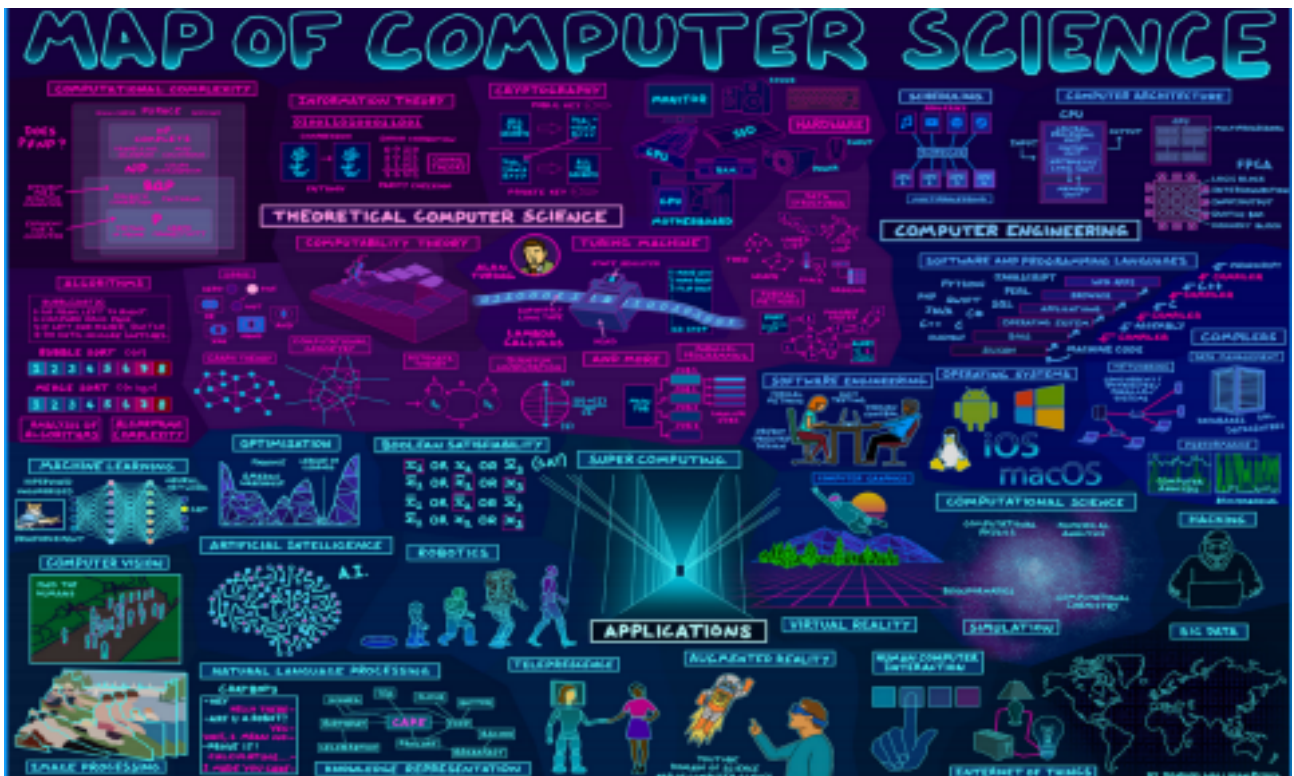

(An Introductory Session by INFINIX and TechCider)

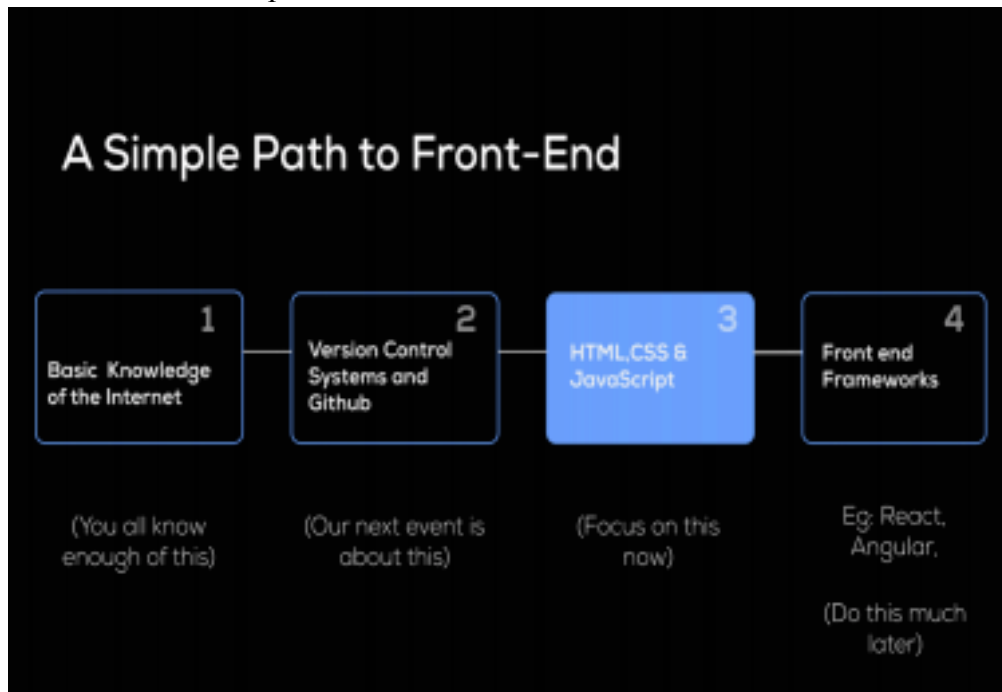

## SESSION 1: “CODE FOR GOOD”

The **Infinix** and **TechCider** clubs of SVKM’s NMIMS, Navi Mumbai Campus jointly organised the most eagerly awaited interactive session for the month of September on 25<sup>TH</sup> September, 2020. The motive of the session was to explain the basic concepts of web development and the target audience was the incoming batch of the new academic year.



Starting strong, Adyasha Padhy, the head of the TechCider club went over the fundamental structures and basic uses of HTML and CSS, the main tools for web development, along with the use of Codepen, an online site for developing websites of our own. She further emphasised on the importance of HTML and CSS, it being that HTML defines the website structure and CSS styles the structure made by HTML.

The session proved to be quite insightful with an active demonstration of a sample code by Shivanshu Singh, the head of the Infinix club which explored the structure and content of both the HTML and CSS files and this helped clear the picture for the freshers.

The attendees were made aware of the various resources that could help them on their journey to successfully create their own website by Shiva Subramanian, the co-head of the TechCider club. This was followed by an FAQ session wherein Madhura Mhatre, the co-head of the Infinix club addressed the commonly asked doubts.

The seminar concluded with an interactive Q&A session which was quite short, given how beautifully everything was explained in the seminar. The presenters did a wonderful job of keeping the session interesting while putting across the key concepts involved in a simple yet engaging manner. All in all, the session proved to be loaded with precious information which should be treasured and will prove extremely useful in future endeavours.
