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1. Any Academic/general inputs, Rules & Policies at the school level

1.1 Academic Guidelines:

These Academic Guidelines are applicable for students of Jyoti Dalal School of Liberal Arts ("the School"), in addition to the guidelines applicable to NMIMS deemed to be a University, as given in Part I of this document.

1.2 What is Liberal Education?

Liberal education is defined as "an approach to undergraduate education that promotes the integration of learning across disciplines and between academic and experiential learning to develop learning outcomes essential for work, citizenship, and life."

1.3 Program Validity:

In continuation to the re-admission rules explained in Part I of this SRB, the maximum duration permissible for completion of the program (in years) is mentioned in the table below:

1.4 "Desirable Student Attributes":

The School is anchored in liberal education and pursues the concept of "Outcome Based Education (OBE)" or "Assurance of Learning (AOL)". The OBE is a continuous improvement process of teaching-learning activities at the School to follow specific pre-defined outcomes that the School expects its students to develop by the time they graduate.

Twenty such "Desirable Student Attributes" have been identified by the School. These are:

- 1.4.14. Interpersonal skills
- 1.4.15. Capacity to work in teams and Leadership skills
- 1.4.16. Capacity to work under uncertainty and a changing environment
- 1.4.17. Capacity to earn a livelihood
- 1.4.18. Commitment to core human values
- 1.4.19. Commitment to life-long learning and growth
- 1.4.20. Maturity and responsible citizenship.



1.5 How do we do it?

The School focuses primarily but not exclusively on Humanities and Social Sciences and select applied areas. The details of individual courses follow.

In addition, it uses a variety of innovative techniques to enable students to develop these attributes. Some of these techniques are:

- 1.5.1. Exposure to and appreciation of creative arts
- 1.5.2. Exposure to IT and frontier technology
- 1.5.3. Workshops for communication skills
- 1.5.4. Workshops for life & social skills
- 1.5.5. Experiential labs exploring self
- 1.5.6. Internship and NGO immersion
- 1.5.7. Organizing student activities and clubs
- 1.5.8. Exposure to regional and international cultural forms
- 1.5.9. Outbound training
- 1.5.10. Travel and Discover Programs

1.6 Academic Year:

- 1.6.1. The School offers a four-year study program leading to the degree of "B.Sc. (Applied Psychology)".
- 1.6.2. Each Academic Year is divided into two Semesters, approximately from July to December (Term I) and January to May (Term II). An Academic Calendar is issued at the beginning of each Academic Year.

1.7 Academic Credits:

- 1.7.1. One Academic "Credit" roughly reflects 15 "classroom" contact hours of learning or 30 "practical" hours of learning or a pro-rata combination thereof.
- 1.7.2. A student is expected to complete 21 Credits per Semester and 126 Credits over the six Semesters in three years and 168 Credits over the eight Semesters in four years, for the Liberal Arts course.
- 1.7.3. A student is expected to complete 173 Credits over the eight Semesters in four years, for the B.Sc. (Applied Psychology) Degree Program

1.8 Student Assessment (Internal & Examination):

- 1.8.1. The School has a system of Internal Continuous Assessment (ICA) as well as Term End Examination (TEE). The proportion of the ICA component in the total assessment may vary from 50% to 100% depending on the Course and its objectives, as declared in the Course Outline.
- 1.8.2. ICA includes elements such as test, assignment, viva/ presentation, class participation and quiz. For Courses with 100% ICA, there would typically be 4 to 5 assessment elements. For Courses with 50% ICA or less, there would be 2 to 3 assessment elements.



2. Examination Guidelines (ICA / TEE, Passing Criteria, Grading system, method of calculation of CGPA, Re-Examination, exceptional cases – medical, etc.)

2.1 Examination weights and credits:

Break up for continuous evaluation of each course will be as under:

A student would undergo continuous assessment for each course/subject in all the semesters/ trimesters. Various components of such continuous assessment would be as decided by the respective course/ subject teacher/ faculty and approved by the Dean /Director of the school/ campus concerned.

2.2 PASSING STANDARDS FOR EACH COURSE (SUBJECT):

Semester-end-exam Passing Criteria for each Course:

To pass a particular course, in any of the Term /Trimester / Semester End examinations or re-examinations, a student must fulfill all of the following criteria:

- Secure a minimum of 40% marks in the Term /Trimester / Semester-end examination of that course and
- Secure a minimum of 40% aggregate marks out of the total marks (that is, internal continuous assessment plus the assessment of the Term /Trimester / Semester end examination) allotted to the course.
- For a course that has only an internal continuous assessment component, passing will be at 40%.

Students who fail to fulfill the above passing criteria will be awarded an 'F' grade.

2.3 Non – fulfilment of Passing Criteria:

A student, who has failed to fulfill the passing criteria as given above, will be required to appear for term/trimester/ semester-end re-examination which will be conducted immediately after declaration of results of the said regular term / trimester / semester-end examination. The internal continuous assessment marks will be carried forward for the term/ trimester / semester-end re-examination.

To be eligible to appear for term/trimester / semester-end re-examination, a student has to submit an online re-examination application available on the student's SAP portal. A student who does not fill in online re-examination form will be denied permission to appear at the examination.

It is the responsibility of such students to keep him/ her informed about such examination dates (timetable). If, in any case, students feel that he/she wants to improve their ICA, they are eligible to take re-admission for the complete academic year. In case of re-admission, the earlier results will stand null & void and student cannot claim the credits of the course/s passed earlier. Students have to appear as fresh candidates for both Internal Continuous Assessment & Term End Examinations.



Only one re-examination will be conducted for each course immediately after declaration of results of final examination and there will not be any further re-examination for whatsoever reason.

Remedial classes would be organized by the School for all the students who fail to fulfil the passing criteria, before the conduct of the re-examination. However these remedial classes will be on demand from students and if a student registers for remedial classes, he / she is expected to maintain 100% attendance. If any student feels that he / she can manage without remedial classes, students can study on their own and appear for the re-examination, later on, such students cannot complaint, that their doubts were not cleared by faculty.

Note: Remedial classes will be conducted by the faculty on demand, if number of students are more than 10. Otherwise, students can get their doubts cleared from the faculty on one to one basis.

2.4 Progression to the subsequent year of the program:

A student who has failed to fulfill the passing criteria of odd semesters courses after re-examination will be allowed to attend the classes and appear at the examination/re-examination of even semesters.

However, a student who fails to fulfill the passing criteria at the end of the academic year (Both semesters) will not be permitted to progress to the next year of the program.

A student will be promoted to the subsequent year of the programme only when he/ she has no F grade at the end of the year after eligible re-examination/s.

In case, the student fails even in the re-examination/s of either odd or even semesters, which are so held, he/ she will not be promoted to the next year of the programme. Such student/s will have the following options:

• To seek readmission in the subsequent year for the entire academic year.

Or

• Appear for the Term-end examination of the course/s in which the student has got "F" grade, in the subsequent year. In such a case, the ICA marks of the course/s will be carried forward of the previous year in which the student had got "F" grade. The student will be required to pay only the re-examination fees. In case of obtaining F grades even in this attempt, student will be given another re-examination chance to clear the same. In total, year-back students will have only two re-exam attempts during the academic year.



Grading System 3.

The University follows a letter grading system leading to the award of a Ten-Point Grade Point Average (GPA) for each term and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) for all the terms until date.

'Letter grades' and corresponding 'grade points' are as under:

Calculation of GPA (Grade Point Average):

Grade point Average for a term will be computed by dividing, the sum of product of grade point of each course/subjects and credit value assigned to each respective course by the sum of credits assigned to all the courses / subjects for the related term.

$$GPA = \frac{\Sigma CG}{\Sigma C}$$

Calculation of CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average):

Cumulative Grade Point Average up to and including a term will be computed by dividing the sum of product of grade point of each course / subject and credit value assigned to each respective course by the sum of credits assigned to all the courses / subjects up to and including the related term till date.

$$CGPA = \frac{\Sigma cG}{\Sigma c}$$

Here:

C = Credit value assigned to a course /subject

G = Grade point value assigned to a student for course / subject corresponding to the letter grade (refer table given)

GPA = Grade point Average shall be calculated for individual term and referred to as Semester/Trimester Grade Point Average. If a student has failed to fulfil passing standard under any head in any subject (i.e. 'Semester/ trimester End Examination' and/ or 'aggregate'), he/ she shall be deemed to have failed in that subject.



General rules

- A student who remains absent from trimester/semester examination/s due to any reason in any Course shall be marked as 'AB' in the result/ grade sheet/ transcript for the Course/s in which he/ she has remained absent. All such students will be allowed to appear for re-examination in the said Course. A student who remains absent in the re-examination would not be able to avail any further re-examination chances.
- In order to receive the degree, diploma, or certificate, the student will have to pass all the examinations (Credit/Non-Credit) of all the years. Students should ensure that he/she has cleared his/her all dues from the respective departments like Admission, Accounts, Library, Hostel, etc. Also, mandatory admission documents are submitted.
- Grievance Redressal (Revaluation/Verification of answer books): In case a student is not satisfied with the result/ grade received by him/her in a particular Course, he/ she may follow the 'Grievance Redressal Procedure' as given in part I of student resource book in case he/ she desires.
- The fees for re-examinations and re-admission will be decided by the University from time to time.
- In case of any disputes/differences, the decision of the University shall be final and binding on the students. If a student desires to institute any legal proceedings against the University, such legal proceedings shall be instituted only in court at Mumbai in whose jurisdiction the application is submitted by the student and not in any other court.
- Modification in criteria/rules: On the recommendation of the Board of Studies of the School and the Board of Examinations, the Academic Council shall have the sole discretionary right to modify all or any of the above criteria at any time without prior notice.

These rules would be applicable to all the students who took admission/ readmission in and after the academic year 2024-25.

Exit Options available to the student/s as per National Education Policy - 2020:

In case a student opts to take exit either at the end of the first year or at the end of the second year, the following certificate / diploma will be awarded to such students provided he/she earns required credits as per National Education Policy and also completes mandatory internship/s:

(1) Exit at the end of the first year: (As an example)

Under Graduate Certificate (Liberals Arts), Under Graduate Certificate (L.A.) etc.,

(2) Exit at the end of the second year: (As an example)

Under Graduate Diploma (Liberals Arts), Under Graduate Diploma (L.A.) etc.,

Such students will be required to complete a compulsory internship to be eligible for award of the above certificate/diploma after the exit. The exit option should be informed by the student concerned before the commencement of the even semester of the Programme.

Students who wish to continue the third year will be awarded a Bachelor's degree. If the student opts for the exit option after the third year, a general degree like BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (APPLIED PSYCHOLOGY) will be awarded without mention of any minor.

Thus the student will have an option to pursue the fourth year of the Programme (Honours). Such students will be required to exercise this option before the commencement of the even semester of the third year.



Division for B.Sc. (Applied Psychology) as per the New Education Policy (NEP)

- Exit One Year B.Sc. (Applied Psychology) UG Certificate Program
- Exit in Two years B.Sc. (Applied Psychology) UG Diploma Program
- Exit in Three Years B.Sc. (Applied Psychology) UG Degree Program
- Finishing Four Year Program UG Honours with Research Degree in B.Sc. (Applied Psychology)

The qualification criteria for entry in the fourth-year Honours with Research programme are as under: 1) Minimum CGPA of 7.5 on a scale of 10.00 at the end of the third year.

2) The said student should have passed examinations of all the course/s in a single attempt.

Students who opt for open electives that have satisfactory and Non-Satisfactory criteria, obtaining satisfactory remark is mandatory before the degree is awarded to such students.

6. JDSOLA Student Council

- 6.1 The JDSOLA Student Council is the apex student body at the School and represents all full-time students of JDSOLA.
