

Second workshop on Technicalities of Memorial Making and Research

- The Moot Court Committee conducted its second workshop titled "Technicalities of Memorial Making and Research" on 30th May, 2021. The workshop witnessed a great response from the students of School of Law, NMIMS, Navi Mumbai and there were a total of 86 participants. The workshop was held on MsTeams.

He has been a part of reputed moot court competitions like, National Law School Trilegal Moot, 30th Jean-Pictet Competition on International Humanitarian Law, Macedonia, International Maritime Law Arbitration Moot, Hong Kong etc.
